FOCUS ON KINDNESS & RIGHTEOUS REWARD

In regard to the realm of advertising and commerce, one online marketing guru claims that "successful marketing starts with the WIIFM factor." Evidently, the acronym WIIFM stands for "What's in it for me?" But the message of the closing verses of Chapter 10 of St. Matthew's Gospel, as with so much of the teaching of Jesus, does turns this idea on its head. In fact, we are called to act kindly towards others simply as the right way to live, with living compassionately and selflessly being its own reward. But there is a paradox here. Because when we put others before ourselves, without any expectation of reward or recompense, we receive what is sometimes called the "prophet's reward" or the "reward of the righteous" in which we see the fulfilling of the divine will. The underlying principle of the "prophet's reward" is that you give to others from what you have received from God. And that the outcome of living righteously and generously for its own sake is that, both humanly and spiritually speaking, we experience a much richer quality of life.

In his famous prayer, St Ignatius of Loyola, founder of the Jesuits, prays that he might "give and not count the cost, toil, and not seek for rest, labour and not ask for reward – except to know that I am doing your will". That is an excellent starting point for anyone wanting to learn how to live their life "under grace", as Saint Paul calls it in Romans Chapter 6 Verse 14. So, if we are welcoming and generous in spirit; and if we even make the smallest of gestures of kindness, such as the example that Jesus gives in Matthew Chapter 10 Verse 42 of simply offering a cup of cold water to a thirsty child, our life and our well-being will be immensely richer for it. Our lives may well not be easy, or free from pain and stress at times, but Jesus promises that our self-giving gestures and acts of true altruism will bring us something infinitely more fulfilling, something that goes far beyond human imagining.
