WELCOME TO TODAY'S WORSHIP

You are warmly welcomed to St. John's Church in Lacey Green, particularly if you are new to our congregation or are a visitor. St. John's is a member Church of the Risborough Team Ministry, serving the parish of Lacey Green, Loosely Row and Speen. We aim to be a family church, welcoming to people of all ages and backgrounds and we actively support our two Parish Schools. St. John's Church dates from 1825 and was originally a "Chapel of Ease" attached to the Parish of Princes Risborough. The chancel and sanctuary at the East end date from 1851, when the chapel was converted into a parish church. Our Samuel Green organ dates from 1792 and is older than the church building. It was originally a parlour organ in a large country house before being brought to St. John's and modified in stages between around 1860 and 1920. It is located in the former Vicar's Vestry, off the chancel.

UPDATE - WORSHIP IN ST JOHN'S CHURCH

After over three months of not having services at St. John's, limited services have resumed at St. John's, with the Said Communion services being held on Tuesdays at 9:30 am and on Sundays at 10:00 am (BST) only for those wishing to attend. The regular Sunday on-line service on Zoom will now be held at 11:00 am (BST). Unfortunately, 8:00 am Services on Sundays remain suspended for the present.

As you may have seen in the press, currently singing in Church or playing wind instruments is not allowed. Holy Communion will be in one kind only and the 2-metre social distancing requirement will apply. Contact details of those attending will need to be recorded in a suitable notebook and details kept for 3 weeks. All attendees will be provided with an A5 sized guidance sheet containing "Do's and Don'ts" based on information from the Diocese of Oxford. Current guidance is that wearing a face mask is strongly recommended and is expected to become mandatory within the next few weeks.

FOCUS ON... THE FEEDING OF THE 5.000

The story of the Feeding of the 5000 reveals the ministry of Jesus to be involved in the everyday lives and needs of the people around him. This is what the theological word "incarnation" means — God becoming a human being and showing us what it means to live an authentic human life. On the one hand this involves the "secular" things that are part of our existence: work, home, recreation, as well, indeed, as the very difficult experiences of suffering and death. Think of all of these things as represented, for example, by our left hand.

Yet on the other hand, let's say the right hand, there are what might be described as the "spiritual" things, that which we seek to engage with through our Church Services: worship of God, prayers, reading of the Bible – and not least being brought close to God in the sacrament of Holy Communion. If we take these two aspects of life and mesh our hands and fingers we are, of course, putting our hands together in prayer. And this imagery of hands joined in prayer is illustrated in the bringing together the hunger of 5000 people with the person of Jesus who took earthly resources and blessed them in order to answer their needs.

One hand on its own, the worldly side, is insufficient to live a full and complete life. That requires the other hand, the spiritual side of the presence of the Living God to complete it. That is what sacrament of the eucharist affirms. We use the physical means of bread and wine to bring us the spiritual gifts that come from God. It is the joining of the material and the spiritual — the putting of the "hands" together as we do when we pray. The well-known story of the feeding of the 5000 does indeed convey a wide variety of messages. But perhaps the illustration of the hands joined in prayer can be one we might especially wish to focus on in these challenging times in which we find ourselves to be.
