## FOCUS ON... REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

We are told by scientists that the matter of which our Planet Earth is composed originally came from the Sun when the Planets which go to make up our Solar System were formed billions of years ago. Since that time, those atoms and molecules, those ashes of a star, have been made and remade many times over in many different ways in order that we might exist in time, at some point in the story of the Universe, as the process of evolution has unfolded. We can say that this means that every person who has ever existed, or ever will exist, has "star quality". Each and every single person is born into the world as a unique individual, precious to God. It is an undeniable reality that the hand of death pulls apart the atoms and molecules of our physical nature so that the physical body which was once created from the ashes of a star is destined to disintegrate and return to the earth. This seems such a brutal process, and all the more so when death comes through the violence and cruelty and tragedy of conflict and warfare.

It is central to the Christian faith, however, that the sadness and sorrow of the Cross made possible the joy and the glory of the Resurrection. The Christian concept of Resurrection speaks to us of a "raising up" to a new level of existence which is far richer than anything we can know in this mortal world. Our confident faith and hope, then, is that what death unmakes, God re-makes.

On Remembrance Sunday, then, we do honour those who have given their lives in war and in the defence of freedom. We commit ourselves to serving the cause of peace and justice, and we give thanks for the Christian hope and promise of the Resurrection. Our faith in the Resurrection to eternal life is a cornerstone of the Christian understanding of the nature of God; and it is at the heart of the Commemoration of Remembrance Sunday; and, indeed, every time we represent upon the altar Christ's own sacrifice and His rising again to new life.
