FOCUS ON... THE PARABLE OF THE TALENTS

In the Parable of the Talents Jesus compares the kingdom of heaven to a man going on a journey who distributes to his servants varying amounts of talents according to their ability. The servant who is given 5 talents manages to make 5 more talents so when the master comes back, he is delighted. "You have proved yourself trustworthy in a few things". he says, "I will now put you in charge of many things". Likewise, the servant who has been given 2 talents has made 2 more. He too is now put in charge of many things. But the third servant, the one who was given just one talent, hid his master's money in the ground. The master is angry with him and says that he should have invested it so as to gain interest. Of course, this Parable of the Talents is not really about money. And it is no surprise that in the English language the word "talent" has taken on the meaning of "gift" or "skill". If you like to watch talent TV shows like "Strictly Come Dancing" or "Britain's Got Talent", you will know that the word "talent" is about what people can do and how good they are at doing it. Partly by reason of a gift they happen to have: but probably all the more so because of the work they have put in to make the best of the talent that they have been given. Likewise, the Parable of the Talents tells us that what really matters is not what we were given to start with but what we have done with it. It is about how generous God wishes to be to us. So much so that he has given us freedom of choice and he blesses us richly when we make the right choices. But He also says to us that He will always stand by us so that, if we are trying to do the right thing and if we are praying for his help and strength, we will get it right more often than not. And then we will find his grace and generosity to be beyond our imagining. We may well not be given what we might hope for; but our God will give us what is in the end is actually in our best interests. So, to him be the glory now and forever.
