Coming to Faith, Growing in Faith

FOCUS ON... MARY THE MOTHER OF JESUS

On the Fourth Sunday of Advent, our thoughts are directed to the person of the Blessed Virgin St. Mary, who was the Mother of our Lord. To the Orthodox Churches of the East and Russia, she is called the "Theotokos", the "god-bearer". She is the greatest of the saints of the Church and Chapter 1 of St. Luke's Gospel tells us why. Mary, a young girl in so many ways innocent in the ways of the world but a faithful Jew trusting the ways of God. Asked by the angelic messenger to take on the massive task of being the mother to the Christ, the anointed one of God, she is told that "nothing will be impossible with God". With a minimum of information, without really knowing more than a fraction of what she is taking on, she simply responds "Here I am, the servant of the Lord, let it be with me according to your word". And so, for theologians, Mary is regarded as both representative of the Jewish people and as a "type" of the Church. Her example is an example for us - willing obedience to God's purposes without necessarily having anything like a detailed route map where he may be taking us. We are simply asked to rely on the promise of Jesus - "I will be with you always until the end of time". Looking back at the formative events of the faith to which we belong, we know that Mary's vocation is to suffer - a "sword will pierce your own heart too", is what she is told when her infant son is presented at the Temple in Jerusalem; the event we recall at Candlemas as the Epiphany season draws to a close at the beginning of February. We know that it is Mary's fate to stand by the Cross whilst her son suffers an excruciating and painful death. Her sorrow teaches us a vital lesson of discipleship that God in Jesus does not promise to protect us from suffering, but to protect us in suffering. So it is that we rightly give true and hearty thanks for the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of Jesus, and for her willing and trusting obedience to the loving purposes of God.

WORSHIP IN CHURCH – COVID-19 MEASURES

Buckinghamshire has now moved into **Tier 3**, but Collective Worship is still permitted providing that the required Social Distancing and other requirements are in force:

- Groups inside church should not be more than 6 persons. Groups should not combine and there must be social distancing between groups.
- Holy Communion will continue to be in one kind only and the 2-metre social distancing requirement and hand sanitising will apply.
- Contact details of those attending will need to be recorded and kept for 3 weeks.
- **When attending worship in church you must continue to wear a face mask within the church building** apart from the celebrant, those reading lessons / leading intercessions and during receipt of Holy Communion.
- **For the Christmas Services, please ensure that you only attend services at the church which are marked as being open for congregations to attend, which this year is only the 10:00 am Service on Christmas Day.** Regrettably, all other Christmas services are on-line only. We have had to take this decision to keep our Parishioners safe.
