FOCUS ON... THE WEDDINGS AT CANA

Ancient church lectionaries included the Wedding at Cana in Chapter 2 of St. John's Gospel as a reading for the Epiphany. In the contemporary Roman Catholic and the Revised Common Lectionary, it only appears for the Second Sunday of Epiphany during Year C. The Church of England, however, includes this event in all three years of the Common Worship Lectionary. The clue to its position in St. John's Gospel narrative lies in the timing, three days after Jesus is baptised; and in its primacy as the first sign that marked his public ministry, revealing his glory. The disciples saw and believed – it was, for them, a moment of epiphany. It was also an act that saved the newlyweds and their families from a potentially disastrous social faux pa. In an ancient Semitic society that took the contracting of marriage extremely seriously, during a ceremony with attendant feasting that lasted some seven days, for the wine to run out was a flaw with profound consequences. Inadequate supplies for the guests, in a culture that regarded hospitality so highly, would have brought disgrace upon the host families, and blighted the newly married couple's nuptial celebrations. And so, this opening miracle in St. John's Gospel account signposts for us that the mission and ministry of Jesus was focused on building reformed, cohesive communities alongside the healing of individuals. The overwhelming generosity offered by Jesus in providing what amounted to over a hundred and twenty gallons of wine for a wedding hints at the lavish prodigality of God's love. And, theologically speaking, it represents "a foretaste of the heavenly banquet". How, then, to faithfully witness to the vulnerable and open-handed extravagance of divine love is always a significant challenge for the Church. This public sign of the divine nature at the Wedding in Cana tells us that meanness is never an option if we are to embody for others the abundant hospitality of the heavenly kingdom.

WORSHIP AT ST. JOHN'S

Buckinghamshire is now in **Tier 5** which is in effect a third National Lockdown. Current Guidance is where churches decide to do so and it has been judged safe, collective worship is still permitted, although the latest guidance from the Bishop strongly encourages churches to suspend collective worship in church and switch to on-line services. The PCC has decided that in-church collective worship will be suspended for the present. This will be reviewed by the PCC later in the month or as and when Guidance changes. This decision has been made to protect our congregation due to the high infection rates in Buckinghamshire including with the new more transmissible strain of Covid-19. (The other churches in the Risborough Team are also suspending in-church services during January.)

We will continue to hold an On-line Morning Worship Service with Hymns on Sundays (at 10:00 am GMT for the rest of January). The Tuesday morning service has been replaced with an On-line Celtic Morning Prayer service at 09:30 am GMT. We will also be opening the church for private prayer on two days during the week (Tuesday Morning from 10:00 to 10:30 am and Thursday Evening from 7:00 to 7:30 pm).
