## **WORSHIP AT ST. JOHN'S**

Following the lifting of most remaining Lockdown restrictions, on 20<sup>th</sup> July, the PCC Standing Committee have agreed to the following changes to worship at St. John's for the immediate future:

- Although no longer legally required, we request that, for the time being due to Covid-19 infection rates remaining high, that the congregation do continue to wear masks in Church, maintain social distancing and sanitise their hands.
- The choir has resumed singing in Church during the main Sunday service. The
  congregation are invited to join in the singing of hymns but are requested to do so
  wearing their masks.
- Holy Communion will continue in one kind only for the time being and will be administered from the area in front of the chancel step (as we have been doing during lockdown).
- The Peace will continue for the time being to be observed discreetly and following social distancing protocols.
- The congregation are asked to observe social distancing as far as possible and the Lady Chapel area will be set aside as a <u>mandatory</u> social distancing area for those who feel they need to socially distance themselves from others. Please respect this.

#### FOCUS ON ...... THE TWELVE APOSTLES

he word Apostle means someone who is sent forth or sent out as an envoy. ambassador, or messenger. According to the list in the Synoptic Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke, the Twelve Apostles called and sent out by Jesus were Simon Peter (also called Cephas) and his brother Andrew, the brothers James and John the sons of Zebedee also known as the "Sons of Thunder". Philip from Bethsaida, Thaddeus also known as Jude or Judas the son of James, Bartholomew who is traditionally identified with the Apostle Nathanael in Saint John's Gospel. Thomas also known as Judas the Twin. James the son of Alphaeus and his brother Matthew or Levi the tax collector. Simon the Canaanite also known as Simon the Zealot, and Judas Iscariot who was the disciple who betrayed Jesus. The Gospel of Saint Mark states that Jesus initially sent out these twelve in pairs to towns in Galilee. Saint John's Gospel does not offer a formal list of Apostles but does refer to the "Twelve" in several places and does identify nine Apostles by name: Peter, Andrew (identified as Peter's brother), the Sons of Zebedee and very likely to be a reference to James and John. Thomas also called Didymus, Judas Iscariot, and Judas (not Iscariot) probably refers to Thaddeus also known as St. Jude. The individual whom Saint John's Gospel names as Nathanael is traditionally identified as the same person that the Synoptic Gospels call Bartholomew, Although the "Twelve Apostles" refer to the twelve who followed Jesus during his lifetime (and later Matthias who was appointed to take the place of Judas Iscariot, it should be noted that Saint Paul (formerly Saul of Tarsus) begins several of his Epistles with "Paul, an Apostle of Jesus Christ", or some variant. Whereas the original twelve were Apostles sent out to the Jews. Paul has a distinct role of being Apostle to the Gentiles after Christ's resurrection and ascent. From 1 John 4:14 we see that all Apostleship finds its meaning in Jesus the Apostle sent by God to be the Saviour of the world.
