WORSHIP AT ST. JOHN'S

Recent UK Government Guidance has been reviewed. No changes are being proposed to in-church worship at St. John's for the present and these will remain in place for the immediate future:

FOCUS ON..... CANDLEMAS

The Feast of the Presentation of Jesus at the Temple in Jerusalem, traditionally known as Candlemas, falls on 2nd February though it is often commemorated on the nearest Sunday. It brings the 40 days of the Christmas and Epiphany season to an end. Candlemas also begins to direct our thoughts towards the coming season of Lent. Holy Week and Easter - "one last look back at Christmas", it is said. "then turn towards the Cross". St. Luke's Gospel Chapter 2 tells us that, 40 days after his birth. Mary and Joseph took the baby Jesus to the Temple to do for him what was prescribed by the Law of Moses, the ritual acts of purification after childbirth and redemption of the first-born son. There they encounter faithful Simeon who prays the prayer which has come to be known as the Nunc Dimittis, the Canticle of Simeon, which is customarily sung or recited as part of the Candlemas ceremonies. Simeon prophecies that here indeed is a child of destiny and speaks of the redemption of the world through Jesus Christ. But he forewarns that this will not be without cost. To Mother Mary he says "and a sword will pierce your own soul too". Also present at the Temple is Anna, a prophetess and a woman of great age who, in the encounter with the infant Christ, praises God and speaks of the importance of this child for all seeking divine redemption. "Nunc dimittis servum tuum", the Song of Simeon - "now let your servant depart". Simeon is ready to let go now, in peace; his faithful work is done. It may be the end of an era for Simeon and Anna, but it is also the beginning of a whole new life for all of us. made possible by this very special child. Christians are called to care for all God's children, both literally and metaphorically, to see past our personal prejudices and our cultural preconceptions. Can we be open, as Simeon and Anna were, to the promise of divine redemption and to the amazing potential of each and every human being?
