FOCUS ON... PASSION SUNDAY

In the 16th Century, the Fifth Sunday of Lent became known as Passion Sunday; and it marks the beginning of the season that the Church calls Passiontide. The season of Passiontide, then, is a name for the last two weeks of Lent, beginning on the Fifth Sunday of Lent, and continuing through what is known in the Orthodox Churches as Lazarus Saturday, on the eve of Palm Sunday. The second week of Passiontide is Holy Week. ending on Holy Saturday, the eve of Easter Day. The name Passiontide, then, refers to the last two weeks of Lent. According to Cyril of Scythopolis, during this time the eremitic monks of the East, who had chosen the desert for a more severe mode of life through self-denial, returned to their monasteries, in readiness for the keeping for the observance of the great Paschal Festival. In 1969, the Roman Catholic Church removed Passiontide from the Novus Ordo, but it is still observed in the extraordinary Form, the Personal Ordinariates, the Anglican Communion, and by Lutherans, Christians use the word "passion" to describe the suffering endured by Jesus during the last few days of his life. and especially the Crucifixion. Indeed, although the English word passion is more usually associated with the idea of strong emotions, its usage in this context stems from the Latin word passio which means "suffering". The name Passion Sunday was derived from the readings traditionally read on this day, drawing parallels between ancient practice of animal sacrifice in the Temple at Jerusalem and the sacrificial offering of Jesus both as priest and victim (see Hebrews 9:12-15). During Passiontide and the closing weeks of Lent, then, our thoughts are more focused on the last days of the earthly ministry of Jesus. For the first four weeks of Lent. Christian worshippers are encouraged to reflect on our own relationship with God. By contrast, Passiontide church services encourage us to meditate more directly on the Passion story, as told in the Canonical Gospels.
